AL Jama-ah to ask President Ramaphosa to create jobs in South Africa's rural villages.

A supplementary question on creating entrepreneurial opportunities in villages in South Africa will be asked by Al Jama-ah's Member of Parliament, Hon Ganief Hendricks to President Cyril Ramaphosa at this afternoon's National Assembly Plenary.

Hendricks who serves on the Portfolio Committee on Small Business Development (SBD) says there are 10 000 villages in South Africa and in 10 of these villages Al Jama-ah has a Constituency. In his supplementary question to the President, he will ask, "What assistance will the President provide to make these villages compliant in establishing Call Centres to offer their services to the more than 40 government departments as well as work from overseas?"

Hendricks supplementary question will follow after the President has responded to a question from the Whip on SBD, Mr Faiez Jacobs.

"With the 4th Industrial Revolution and cyber civilisation towards a new abnormal, it is important to create an entrepreneurial psyche, so no one is left out in South Africa," says Hendricks.
