MANDELA DAY – AL JAMA-AH's Leader to spend his 67 minutes in Soweto

The Al Jama-ah Party is calling on South Africans to set aside time to reflect on the founding values of the broad African liberation struggles which influenced the principles of the Constitution.

The anti-apartheid struggle was about the people, their pain, losses and hopes for a democratic country and ideals of ensuring a just and fair society to accomplish the spirit of peace and true liberation.

Sadly, our beloved country is facing challenges from all angles such as politically, economically, and socially. Hon Ganief Hendricks, Member of Parliament will be spending his 67 minutes of Mandela Day in Protea South in Soweto. He will be joined by a Palestinian delegation who will hand out the medals engraved with 'Nelson Mandela' to the team players who have reached the finals.
